

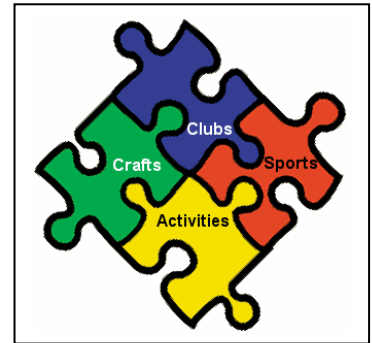
JOIN AN EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY!

DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD- Years 10-13

Monday 16.15

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award is the world's leading youth achievement award, bringing together practical experiences and life skills to equip young people for life.

The Award is voluntary, non-competitive, enjoyable and balanced, and requires effort over time. There are three levels to the Award: Bronze, Silver and Gold. Young people design their own Award programme, set their own goals and record their own progress. They choose a Service, Physical Recreation, Skills activity, go on an Adventurous Journey and, to achieve a Gold Award, take part in a residential project. The only person they compete against is themselves, by challenging their own beliefs about what they can achieve.



SEWING CLUB - Year 4-7

Sewing Club consists of giving the pupils the opportunity to learn to use a needle and thread. They will make simple items, some decided by me and some chosen by them. It is a process that requires patience and can be very challenging for some children. I hope that they will be able to sew simple stitches, begin their own sewing and finish off. Also I hope to teach them how to sew a button on and to hem.

A big part of Sewing club is also learning to knit. The children are encouraged to do this so that we can make squares to sew into a blanket for charity.
