Primary School News

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
This term years 1, 2, 3 and 6 have been doing gymnastics. They are enjoying this activity very much and they are working towards a routine to perform at the end of this term.

Following their enjoyable visit to the Palma aquarium year 4 are now carrying out independent internet research on various shark species and presenting their findings in a series of slides.


Great White Shark

They took centre stage at the now established Bellver talent show on the last day of the Christmas term and have since then had a break due to external exams for all the musicians in the group.


However, due to ever popular demand, the rock band is back! Watch this space for where and when they will be performing.....



Unicef 🙆 World Education Games 2013

The World Education Games is an annual global online challenge to get all students (4-18 years of age) across the planet excited about learning, and to give the top students in all schools an opportunity to see how they measure up against the best in the world. Last year, over 5 million students were a part of what is now the world's largest online education event.

This year, the games took place online on the 5^{th} , 6^{th} and 7^{th} of March. In Bellver International College, pupils from Years 7-11 took part, answering questions on the areas of Literacy, Maths and Science. Over the three days that the pupils participated, they managed to answer over 25,500 questions correctly! The pupils really enjoyed the experience, eager for the challenge and to be the best.
